## Performance Review

### Cargo Throughput

During 4<sup>th</sup> Qtr. (Apr-Jun 2022) total oilseed imports reduced to 685 KTN out of which FAP has efficiently handled 497 KTN i.e., around 73% of the total oilseed import accumulating total throughput of 2.83 million tons during FY2021-22.

Supporting the initiative of the Government of Pakistan to overcome the National Wheat Shortage, FAP is consistently handling the wheat import for the past two years. During FY2021-22, the Terminal has efficiently handled around 1 million tons of bulk wheat imports.

### Simultaneous Berthing of Two Vessels

During the month of June, FAP has efficiently handled two vessels simultaneously i.e., Soybean & Rice.



## Installation of Grab Unloaders

FAP always endeavored to acquire the latest technology for delivering the most efficient & secure cargo handling solutions. To further extend its services, FAP recently installed two Grab Unloaders in June 2022 which has tremendously strengthened its operational capacity of handling multiple cargoes with high discharge rates of 2,600 Tons Per Hour.

The new unloaders will enable FAP to handle gearless Panamax vessels of non-free-flowing cargoes such as DAP & PKE.

It will also minimize the vessel turnaround time which will result in substantial Dispatch Earnings & Freight Savings to the customers and subsequent Foreign Exchange Savings to the National Exchequer.

## Construction of Additional Bagging Facility for Fertilizer

To perform efficient & real-time bagging of fertilizer with minimized wastage, FAP terminal is constructing additional Bagging for Fertilizer/DAP importers.

## Construction of New Sheds

FAP has constructed new storage sheds to provide spacious and secure storage for empty bags of its customers.
